WHY DO WORDS MATTER?

The language we use makes a massive difference to the way we think.

Words used by the police and media can trivialise male violence against women and girls, contributing to victim-blaming narratives, discouraging victim-survivors from coming forward and preventing perpetrators being held accountable.

Police forces and agencies have a duty of care to the public to use language which empowers victim-survivors. Statements, press releases, media interviews, and briefing documents must use active language that holds the perpetrator to account.
